Introduction

This newspaper cuttings collection originates from the Namibian Bibliographical Data Project. It contains newscuttings about selected subjects, which have been collected in varying intensity and consistency, and from several newspapers in Namibia, but mostly from New Era and The Namibian, with occasional additions from material outside Namibia.

It is by no means a comprehensive collection, but can provide a brief overview and first introduction on developments on several issues. In particular, the topical areas of traditional authorities; ex-combatants; historical and heritage issues; the book sector; labour; the land question; and uranium mining, have been collected quite comprehensively over a long period.

This accession is not a finalized item; collection on several (but not all) topics is continuing.

The collection should be seen in conjunction with the many other newscuttings collections in the National Archives, covering different time periods and different collection policies and origins.

It is physically organized in two series: A and B

Series A is accommodated in archival boxes. Series B is accommodated in envelopes, and consists mostly of smaller collections where no further material will be added because collection was discontinued, or because the issue got only a limited period of media attention (such as the Cultura 2000 case), or where there is only occasional media attention (such as the collection on “fairy circles”).

This finding aid is not final and will be revised from time to time.
