Private Accession A.1001 Microfiche Catalogues

Introduction

The microfiches in this accession had been kept at the Ministry of Education Resource Centre/Library for reference but were no longer accessible at the centre due to lack of functional viewing equipment. They were transferred to the Archives in considerable disarray during renovation work at the library in 2012.

The bulk of the transferred microfiches consists of South African library catalogues. The basic original context of the various series was restored, although at this stage no attempts were made to restore full alphabetical/numerical order within the series where they had been brought into disarray.

Part of the transferred material were also six monographic microfiche publications. These were taken into the general microfiche collection of the National Archives and catalogued on the ARCAT database. (See listing in Part B).

Extent:

The Accession consists of 13 standard archival boxes with an uncounted number of microfiches.

Note on Preservation:

Some fiches are silver halide, the majority are diazo copies. The diazo copies are light-sensitive. As far as the fiches had been stored in display sheets (card holders), they were left in the sheets, but removed from the upright stands and ringbinders and packed into standard archival boxes for light and dust protection. More recent updates were found loose in single envelopes or in bundles without envelopes. Rubber bands were removed from those bundles.

Due to a long period of storage under less than optimal conditions, there is substantial dust contamination on some sections of the material.
